

To all people to whom this present Deed of Sale shall come to be soon or read **Knowe ye** that Great James an Indian, and going by that name of Great James, with the free Consent of my son John Womstoon, as also with the consent of Joseph Tuptoowinnin deceased, his widow and Indian all of Naticke, have by vertue of a grant from the Honorable Generall Courts held at Boston the nineteenth day of May Anno Domini one thousand six hundred & eighty, with the Approbation of the Honorable Maie Daniell Gookins, for and in Consideration of six pound ten shillings, foure pounds in Money and fifty shillings in goods, to us then paid by Thomas Martin of Marlborough, in the County of Midd: shoemaker, the receipt whereof we the said Great James & John Womstoon his son with the widow of Joseph Tuptoowinnin aforesaid, doe by these presents acknowledge, and therewith to be fully satisfied and paid, and doe fully & lawfully and absolutely acquitt, exonerat and discharge the foresaid Thomas Martin his heirs exors, Administrators & assigns for ours, by these presents hath granted Bargained and sold Allocated Enfeoffed & confirmed, unto the abovesaid Thomas Martin a parcel of Indian Land, lying neare Marlborough, Containing Twenty Arours, be it more or less, that is to say about fouteen archs of vpland, and six of middow, being bounded, the vpland and about ^{three} arours of the middow on the north with foute Middow brooke, the west of the middow lying in two parcels on the North side of foute Middow brooke one towards the west end of my foresaid land and the other parcel towards the east end thereof also bounding upon Maie Gookins Indian both the small parcels of middow on the north side the brooke, my whole land being bounded on the west with Marlbury Town line, and Southerly with a stake at one corner, and a Clarke oak at the other corner, and for running down betwixt the vpland and the swamp easterly toll it mark with and take in that parcel of middow that lies on the north side the brooke on the Eastward of the land, all which was marked out by the abovesaid Great James himself, to have and to hold the abovesaid parcels and every pt and parcel thereof, to him the said Thomas Martin his heirs and assigns for ours, to his and theirs only proper use and behoof, and if the aforesaid Great James and John his son, and Joseph Tuptoowinnins widow, doe all Couenant & promise, for us our heirs exors Administrators & assigns to and with the aforesaid Thomas Martin his heirs exors Administrators or assigns, that he the said Thomas Martin his heirs exors Administrators or assigns shall or may at all times & from time to time, for ours hereafter peaceably and quietly, have hold occupy possess & enjoy the abovesaid bargained and assigned parcels and every pt & parcel thereof, without the lawfull Let, Claims, trouble Eviction, or expulstion, of us the said Great James or John his son, with the widow of Joseph Tuptoowinnin, or of any of our heirs exors Administrators or assigns, or of any other person or persons whatsoever, It is further granted by the abovesaid Great James his son & the aforesaid widow, that the abovesaid Thomas Martin, shall have full power and liberty to feed his Cattle on any of the Comon Indian Land, and also to cut and carry off firewood Timber and fenssing stuff thereof for his necessary use from time to time, as they shall have occasion for, himself and heirs for ours, In witness whereof we the abovesaid Great James my son & abovesaid widow have put to our hands and seals this 5th day of July In the yeare of our Lord God one thousand six hundred eighty, the

To all people to whom this present deed of sale shall come to be seen or read Know ye that I Great James an Indian, and going by that name of Great James, with the free consent of my son John Womscoon as also with the consent of Joseph Tupkoowinnin deceased, his widdow and Indian all of Natick, have by virtue of a grant from the Honorable Generall Courte, held at Boston the ninteenth day of May Anno Domi one Thousand six hundred and eighty, with the approbation Honored Major Daniell Gookins, for and in consideration of six pounds tenn shillings, four pounds in money and fifty shillings in goods, to us already paid by Thomas Martine of Marlborough in the County of Midd: Shoemaker, the receipt where of we the said Great James and John Womscoon his son with the widdow of Joseph Tupkoowinnin aforesdaid, do by those presents acknowledge, and herewith to be fully satisfied and paid, and do fully easely and absolutly acquit exonerat and discharge the foresaid Thomas Martin, his heires executors, administrators and assignes for ever; by these presents both Granted Bargained and Seald, aleoned confessed and confirmed, unto the abovesaid Thomas Martine a prsell of Indian Land lying neare or less, that is to say about fourteen achors of upland, and about six of Middow, being bounded, the upland and bout three achors of the middow on the north with forte middow booke and the rest of the middow lying in two prsells on the North side of forte middow brooke one towards the west end of my foresaid land and the other prsell towards the east end there is also bounding upon Major Gookns I mean both the small psells of middow on the north side (of) the brooke my whole land being bounded on the west with Marlborough town line, and southerly with a stacke at one conrner, and a blacke oak at the other corner and so running down betwixt the upland and the swampe easterly till it meets with the in that psell of middow that lyes on the north side of the brooke on the Easterend of the land; all which was marked out by the abovesaid Great James himself, To have and to hould the above granted premisses and every pt and psell thereof to him the said Thomas Martin his heires and assignes for ever, to his and there onely proper use and behooff, and I the aforesaid Great James and John his son, and Tupkowinnim widdow, doe covenant and promiss for us and our heires executors administrators and assignes to and with the aforesaid Thomas Martin his heires executors administrators or assignes; that he the said Martin his heires executors and administrators and assignes shall or may at all times and from time to time for ever hereafter peacably quietly, have hould occupy posses and Injoy the above said bargained and assigned premisses and every pt and psell thereof without the lawfull lett claims trouble eviccion or expulccion of us the said Great James or John his son with the widdow of Joseph Tukoowinnin or of any of our heires executors administrators or assigns or any other person or persons whatsoever; It is further granted by the above said Great James his son and the aforesaid woddow, that the abovesaid Thomas Martin shall have full power and liberty to feed his cattle on any the Comon Indian Land, and

also to cut and carry off firewood timber and fenceing stuff thereof for his necessary use from time to time as they shall have occasion for himself and heires forever.
